
ORDER

On February 12, 2014, the parties appeared before the Court. Three motions had been filed and were set for the Court's docket call: (1) the University of Louisville's motion for order of mediation; (2) the University of Louisville's motion for order requiring Norton to join the Commonwealth as a party; and (3) Norton's motion for leave to file an amended complaint. The Court having heard argument from the parties, and being otherwise sufficiently advised, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED THAT:

1. The parties have agreed to mediate. The Court will appoint a mediator and once a mediator is appointed, a mediation between the parties is to be conducted on a reasonably prompt schedule to be determined by the mediator in collaboration with the parties.
2. The University of Louisville's motion for order requiring Norton to join the Commonwealth as a party is denied without prejudice to the University's ability to re-file at a later date if the parties are not able to reach a resolution through mediation.
3. Norton's motion to file an amended complaint is held in abeyance until after the parties or mediator have made a final report to the Court indicating the mediation concluded.

4. The case is stayed until such time as the parties have conducted a mediation, the parties or mediator have made a report to the Court as required by Franklin Circuit Local Rule 14.05 regarding whether an agreement was reached, and the Court enters an order lifting the stay.

5. As a result of the stay, all case related deadlines are hereby extended. The parties have agreed that upon the parties or the mediator filing a final report with the Court indicating the mediation concluded, that Norton will have fifteen (15) days from the filing date to respond to the University's counter-claim and the parties will have twenty-one (21) days from the filing date to respond to outstanding discovery.




